Tarrant County Muslim Physician Luncheon

During the last quarter the number of patients has increased due to layoffs and current economical situations. We are very grateful to our physicians for providing the needed services at the clinic.

We organized a luncheon for the Tarrant County Physicians at The Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders, Fort Worth Texas. We are very thankful to Dr. Shadan Mansoor and Ms. Rhenda Grey for providing the venue and arranging the lunch with the support of Cancer Centre. Forty physicians mostly the newly arrived physician attended the luncheon program.

Dr. Shadon Mansoor presented a brief information about the services provided by the Cancer Centre. This was followed by Dr. Hujefa Vora, past president of Tarrant County Medical Society – Arlington branch, who briefly introduce MCC's Al-Shifa Clinic and Dr. Ahmed, Chairman of MCC for Human Services. Dr. Ahmed presented on the current state of health care in United States, elaborating on lack of needed care for indigent residents especially immigrants. He further outlined the goals and the purposes of establishing the free medical clinic – Al Shifa in 1998. This is the first free medical clinic in Texas established by a Muslim organization providing services to all indigent residents irrespective of their religion, race and ethnicity and national origin. He also described MCC for Human Service's other projects such as Annual Health Fair, Breast Cancer Educational, Domestic Violence, Child Abuse, Healthy Marriages and Mental health programs. MCC is still the only Muslim organization in the state of Texas providing both free medical and social services.

Dr. Ahmed further informed about developing a new project, "Physician Network" where he is asking internists and specialists to provide medical care to indigent in their own offices at no cost or on a reduced fee. Al Shifa will continue to program the lab work at a markedly discounted rate through an arrangement with "Quest lab"

The presentation generated a great interest in the physicians and several newly arrived physicians completed the registration form indicating their interest in joining the physician network or coming to the Al – Shifa Clinic as a volunteer.

Dr. Ahmed thanked Dr. Sobia Ghazalli, Dr. Mohammad Memon, Dr. Imran Patel and Dr. Asad Dean for contacting the new physicians encouraging them to attend the luncheon program.

Dr Ahmed is thankful to all volunteer physicians at Al Shifa clinic for their sincere commitment to provide medical care to the uninsured residents of the community.

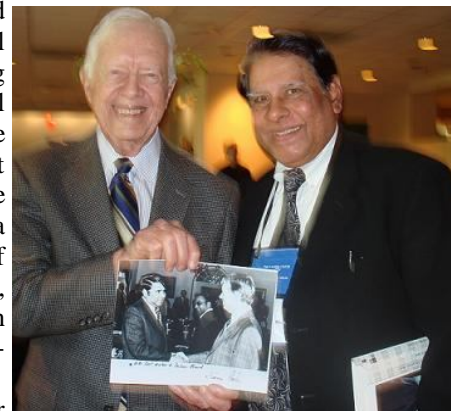

At the invitation of President Carter, Dr. Ahmed visited the Carter Center in Atlanta, GA on April 16th and 17th, 2009 to participate in the executive briefing on Carter Center's Peace and Health Programs. It was a great opportunity to meet President and Mrs. Carter who summarized various programs and participated in question and answer sessions.

The Carter Center's Peace Program's major focus is to strengthen freedom and democracy in nations all over the world, securing for people the political and civil rights that are the foundation for a just and peaceful society. The Carter Center has been a pioneer in the field of election observation, monitoring more than seventy national elections.

The Carter center second major project is to provide health care in the most poor and neglected areas of the world. Under the leadership of Carter Center, the Guinea worm disease is totally eradicated without using vaccine or medication through health education and low tech methods. This goal was accomplished in twenty years of persistent work. The Carter Center is also a leader in the fight against the debilitating parasitic infection "river blindness". They are targeting to eliminate this disease from Africa and South America within the next 5-10 years. The other health care center provides are to eliminate the blindness caused by Trachoma, Lymphatic Filariasis and Schistosomiasis. These illnesses are making millions of people disabled in African countries.

President Carter, who turned 86 years, received a "Noble Prize for Peace," is still very active in all the health and peace projects of the Carter's center. It was an unforgettable and unique experience to meet a person of deep faith and sincere commitments to promote humanity and peace in the world.

An Honor for Dr. Basheer Ahmed from The Lone Star Crescent June

The founder of Muslim Community Center for Human Services was honored at the Regional Conference of Islamic Society of North America (ISNA) during the banquet on May 30th, 2009 for his medical and social services to the community.
